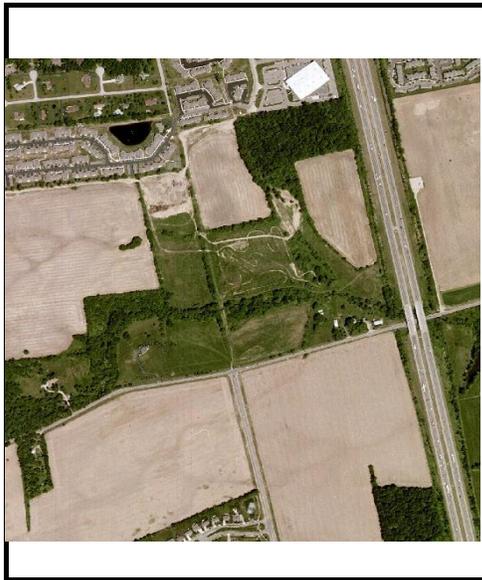
This project also provides funding for reproduction of the City's street map which is created internally by City staff.

Funding required for this project is estimated to be 65,800 per year (adjusted for future cost using 3%) for reproduction of the City maps and \$10,500 for reproduction and mounting of the aerial photos in 2016. This project is provided for in the annual operations budget capital items under Engineering Department 408.

Transportation Plan and Thoroughfare Plan Update

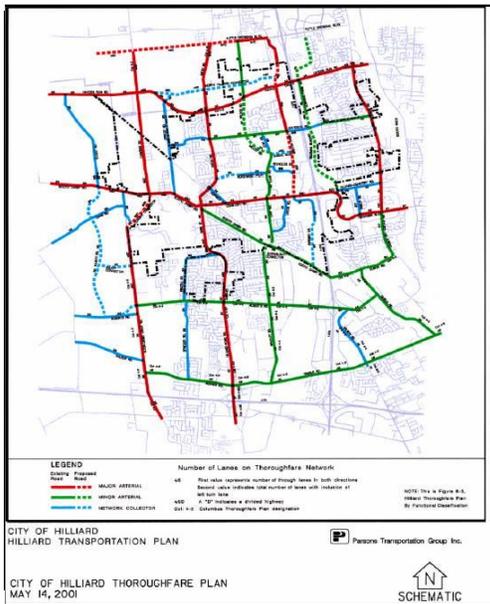
Every five to eight years the City of Hilliard embarks upon an extensive traffic study to assist the City in determining its long-range planning needs with respect to transportation-related infrastructure. As part of this study, existing traffic data is collected and existing and proposed land use and density information is used to develop long-range traffic volumes along major corridors. The results help to determine where traffic signals may be warranted, where transportation improvements may be necessary to mitigate capacity or safety problems, and the development of a Thoroughfare Plan that establishes general corridor alignments and right-of-way widths. The study also enables the City to update the master Bikeway Plan, Access Management Guidelines, and Traffic Impact Study Guidelines for development.

The last update of the Transportation Plan and Thoroughfare Plan was commenced in 2008 and adopted in late 2011 by Ordinance No. 11-36 adopted on 10/24/2011.

Land Use & Public Spaces Master Plan

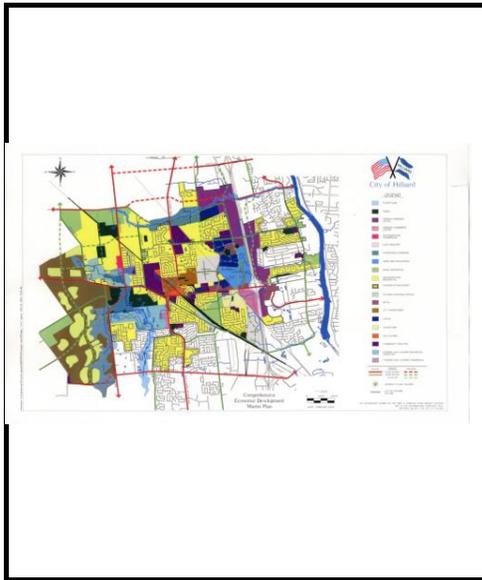

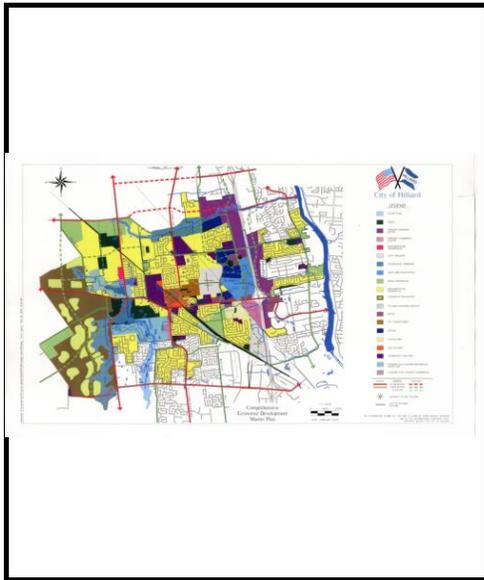
**C.I.P. No. AP-4
Sanitary Sewer Master Plan Update**

This project is necessary to analyze the sanitary sewer collection system needs for alternative development scenarios that may arise during the process of updating the Land Use Master Plan or as alternate development plans are proposed during land development. This project consists of hydraulic studies and studies to determine the amount of sewerage generated for undeveloped areas based upon their land use. These studies, in turn, determine the necessary trunk sewers and other facilities necessary to serve development in these areas of the City. A key component in the necessity of this plan update is the Big Darby Development area.

The last update of this plan was commenced in 2008 and adopted in 2011 by Ordinance No. 11-36 adopted on 10/24/2011.

Storm Sewer Master Plan Update

This project is necessary to analyze the storm sewer system needs of the City based on any alternative development scenarios that may arise during the process of updating the Land Use Master Plan or as alternate development scenarios are proposed by potential land development. This project consists of hydrologic and hydraulic studies for undeveloped portions of the City based upon land uses and would identify storm sewer projects necessary to properly manage storm water runoff in these undeveloped areas as development occurs. This project will be completed in conjunction with and supplement the City's NPDES Phase 2 requirements (CIP ST-32). Another key component in the necessity of this plan to comply with and be updated for the Big Darby Development area.

The last update of this plan was commenced in 2008 and adopted in 2011 by Ordinance No. 11-36 adopted on 10/24/2011.

Water Master Plan Update**

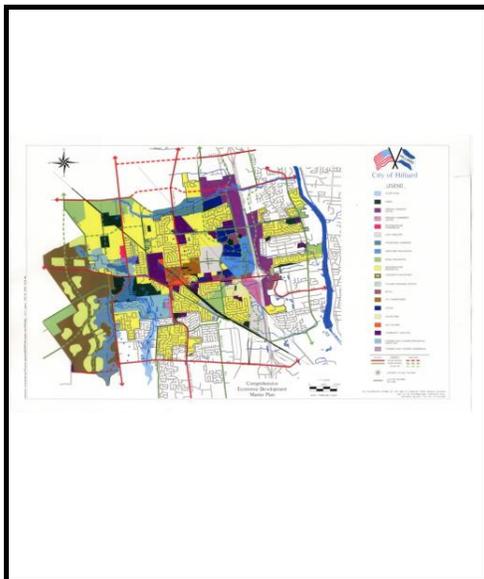

The Water Master Plan also identifies water distribution system improvements necessary to adequately serve recently annexed property. Another key component in the necessity of this plan to comply with and be updated for the Big Darby Development area.

Zoning Code and Development Standards

This project also provides funding for the establishment of development standards in key and/or sensitive areas throughout the City including the Old Hilliard District, the I-270 corridor, the abandoned railroad corridor, the Big Darby Creek watershed, the Hellbranch Run watershed, the Hayden Run corridor, and the Environmentally Sensitive Development Area (ESDA).

Hilliard City Council developed a Strategic plan in 2012.

Its top initiative in this plan is: "Ensure city code is in-line with the comprehensive plan".

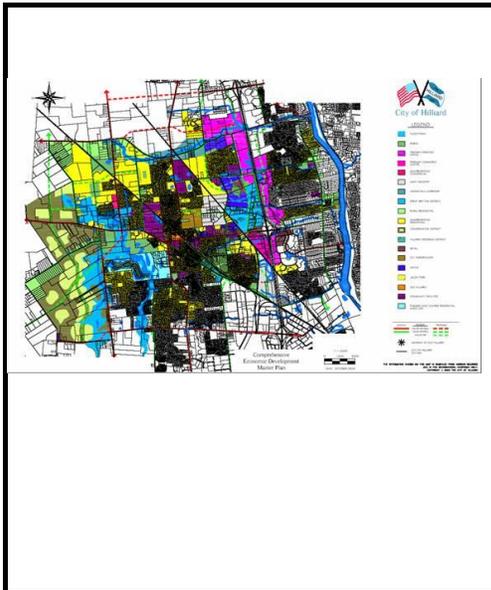
As a result a consultant is needed to assist the city in implementing the necessary code changes and to prepare development and engineering standards.

This is anticipated to be a 2 year process and the associated cost are estimated to be \$300,000 provided for in 2013 and 2014
