As city manager, my goal will be to communicate key information to City Council so its members can best formulate policy and make strategic decisions. I also will be the primary conduit of City Council's priorities to members of the Administrative team.

Because an informed community is an engaged community, that philosophy of open communication will extend to our residents and to our corporate neighbors, too. Beyond informing residents, I hope to also engage with the community in meaningful dialogue around issues and opportunities impacting the City and the services it provides.

And, of course, I'm going to spend a lot of time getting to know Hilliard. Fortunately, I am pretty familiar with this amazing community because I have worked for the City of Dublin for the past 27 years. My awareness of the great things happening in Hilliard was part of the reason I was so excited about this opportunity!

They say you don't know what you don't know, and during the next year I'm sure I will be learning a lot – and asking a lot of questions. I will be investing a great deal of time in community outreach, getting to know the people, businesses, and community culture that make Hilliard unique.

Being the first city manager is both a daunting task and an exciting opportunity, but fortunately I'm not in this alone! I look forward to getting to know this community – and getting to know many of you personally.



Chipper Service

The City's weekly chipper service begins Monday, April 20, and continues through October. Residents should follow the color-coded chipper schedule to determine which day, Monday-Thursday, brush and branches are collected for chipping during the summer.

Place tree limbs and shrub clippings at the curb by 7 a.m. on the scheduled day of service for your street. Trimmings must be at least 4 feet long. Piles should not include vines, thorns, roots, grass of any kind, or foreign materials such as metal, lumber, nails, wire, string, rope, or staples.

When a tree service or landscape company is hired to cut down trees or clear areas, it is solely responsible for that removal.

Yard Waste

Grass clippings, leaves, branches, and other yard waste are collected weekly for Hilliard residents. Organic waste should be placed in brown paper bags or rigid containers clearly labeled with yard waste stickers, which are available at the Hilliard Municipal Building, 3800 Municipal Way.

Please cut branches to less than 4 feet in length and tie them into bundles with string or twine. Each container, bag, or bundle must weigh less than 50 pounds and be free of rocks, dirt, and plastic bags.

Tree Pruning and Maintenance

The City is responsible for trees in the public rights of way. Homeowners are responsible for trees in their yards. The City will only prune or trim trees in the public rights of way.

Vacation House Check

Planning to leave town for a few days?

Mosquitoes

By mid to late summer, mosquitoes carrying diseases such as West Nile Virus can begin showing up in Hilliard.

Within Hilliard, spraying for mosquitoes is performed by Franklin County Public Health, which typically sprays when a trapped mosquito tests positive for West Nile Virus. The City does not spray for mosquitoes, but when spraying is planned we notify residents in affected areas through social media and, when possible, through our e-newsletter, "Happening in Hilliard."

HELP EVERYONE ENJOY OUR POOLS THIS SUMMER

A day of family fun at the pool often comes with the question of what residents are allowed to bring into City of Hilliard aquatic facilities.

Here's a break-down of the kinds of toys and food our guests can bring into the pools this summer:

Food

We offer some great food and beverage options at our pool concession stands, but we also know some folks want to bring their own snacks to enjoy.

Guests are welcome to bring in outside food and beverages in coolers, but for the safety and cleanliness of our facilities there are a few rules we ask families to follow.

- Glass containers are strictly prohibited.
- Alcohol, tobacco products, and vaping are prohibited.
- We don't allow our guests to bring in pizza boxes, but it's certainly fine for our guests to bring slices of pizza into the facility if you have transferred them to a cooler or similar container.
- Outside food deliveries are prohibited.

Pool toys

Patrons of City of Hilliard swimming pools are allowed to throw approved toys in the water at both facilities. Approved toys are squishy, cloth-style balls designed specifically for safe pool use. Beach balls smaller than 24 inches in diameter also are permitted. Diving rings and diving sticks may be used if they are dropped rather than thrown. Examples of acceptable toys are on display at both pools.

Pool staff will not allow Nerf balls, footballs, and other sports balls; Frisbee-style discs; and other toys not specifically designed for pool use. The "gutterball" game also is prohibited for the safety of all of our swimmers. Patrons are encouraged to check with pool staff before taking toys into the water.

In addition, patrons at the Clyde "Butch" Seidle Community Pool may play catch or participate in similar activities in the grassy area to the north of the pool, provided their activities do not pose a risk of injury to other patrons.

The pools will continue to allow mesh infant floats and transparent flotation devices less than 4 feet in diameter. Patrons should check with pool staff before bringing squirt guns of any kind into the pools.

YOUR TAX DOLLARS AT WORK

When residents entrust their tax dollars to the City of Hilliard, how are they it re-invested in our community? Great question! Let's look at what happens to your local income tax and property tax dollars, and how the City works to be a good steward of the resources entrusted to it.

Income Taxes

The City of Hilliard's primary funding source is a 2-percent income tax paid by individuals who:

- Work within Hilliard corporate limits (regardless of where they live) or
- Live in this community and do not pay at least 2-percent local income tax to another municipality.

At 2 percent, Hilliard's income tax rate is lower than that collected by Columbus and Worthington (2.5 percent) and is the same as that paid by Dublin, Grove City, and Westerville. So, residents who work in any of those communities get a 2-percent credit and do not pay income taxes to Hilliard.

About 70 percent of general fund revenue comes from income taxes. We also receive revenue from sources such as service fees, real estate taxes, fines, permits, licenses, earnings on investment, government shared tax, and grants.

Regardless of whether they pay taxes to the City, every

Did You Know?

In 2019, the City of Hilliard received a Moody's Investors Service Aaa bond rating, the highest rating Moody's provides. Moody's also reports that it projects a stable outlook for the City's financial future. As of 2019, only 15 other municipalities in Ohio had a Aaa rating.

Hilliard resident age 18 and older must file an income tax form through RITA – the Regional Income Tax Agency. No tax return is required for retirees with no earned income or those who are permanently disabled, however you must register with the city. A link to RITA can be found at hilliardohio.gov/taxes/.

In 2019, the City collected \$28.8 million in income taxes from withholding, business income, and individuals. The City reinvests much of this money into our community through capital projects such as road construction, parkland acquisition and development, infrastructure, and other amenities that improve quality of life, promote economic development, and attract and retain businesses. In 2019, \$17.8

2019 General Fund Revenue



















2019 Property Tax Distribution (per Dollar)



million was scheduled for capital improvement projects. Income tax dollars also pay for general fund expenses such as the personnel, contractual services, utilities, and other things needed to run the City government. In the 2019 operating budget, 57 percent of operating expenses were slated to fund personnel; almost 58 percent of personnel expenses funded police/safety services.

The City allocates 65 percent of expenses for operating expenses, 25 percent for capital improvement projects, and 10 percent for street maintenance. Street maintenance is funded through existing funds rather than by borrowing, which means the City does not pay interest to fix potholes and resurface neighborhood streets.

One example of the City's strong financial position is that it maintains a reserve fund that reflects 25 percent of each year's operating budget. This "rainy day" savings account is intended to cover unexpected costs, lower-than-anticipated revenues, and opportunities that may arise during the year.

Property Taxes

The City of Hilliard and Hilliard City Schools are separate governmental entities that receive the bulk of their funding from two different sources. Where the City is primarily funded through income taxes, property taxes are largely invested in our schools. The city and the school district also have different geographic boundaries, so living within

Hilliard City School District does not mean you necessarily live within the City of Hilliard.

While Hilliard City Schools' primary funding source is residential and corporate property taxes, property taxes also help fund Norwich Township (including fire services), the Columbus Metropolitan Library, Tolles Technical School, and various agencies within Franklin County (Children's Services, Franklin County Board of Developmental Disabilities, Metro Parks, Columbus Zoo, services for senior citizens, and alcohol, drug, and mental health services.)

The City of Hilliard only receives 1.74 percent of local property taxes (less than two cents of every dollar collected.)

Transparency

The City of Hilliard is transparent about its stewardship of taxpayer resources. Our annual operating and CIP budgets (as well as our Comprehensive Annual Financial Report) are available at hilliardohio.gov/departments/finance/.

EXPLORERS PROGRAM PREPS FUTURE POLICE OFFICERS

Sgt. Suzanne Muraco's career began as an Explorer in 1990.

Sixteen-year-old Suzanne Young heard the announcement on the high school intercom promoting a law enforcement program for teens, and something in her sparked.

It was 1990, and the Hilliard High School sophomore hadn't determined what her career path would be, outside of her after-school gig flipping burgers at McDonald's.

She picked up a flyer at the school office for Law Enforcement Exploring, a program being offered for teens by Hilliard police.

And even though her dad "grilled the Explorer advisor like a cheese sandwich" at the informational meeting, her path was set.

Now, she's Hilliard police Sgt. Suzanne (Young) Muraco.

"My parents thought it was a phase. That's always been our joke," said Muraco, who has now served with Hilliard Division of Police for 24 years in various roles, including as an auxiliary officer, patrol officer, training officer, and detective sergeant.

"I remember getting our uniforms, and I thought it was the coolest thing ever — those polyester pants and patches that said Hilliard Police Explorers," she remembered. "But I was so proud."

Muraco credits her experience with HPD's Explorer Post 2286 with leading her into a career she remains passionate about decades later. And although some of the practices have evolved, the program continues to produce future law enforcement officers.

Exploring is a worksite-based program of Learning for Life, a subsidiary of the Boy Scouts of America. It's open to males and females ages 14 through 20 who have completed the eighth grade.

Law Enforcement Explorer posts give youths insight into law enforcement careers and offer hands-on career activities through training and practical experiences. Additionally, Exploring promotes personal growth through character development, respect for the rule of law, physical fitness, good citizenship, and patriotism.

The goal at the Hilliard Division of Police is to aid young men and women who feel they are interested in police work, said Officer Mike Deaton, who has served as an advisor since 2000. But it also serves as a "character-builder."

"It helps teens get hands-on experience before making the commitment," said Deaton. "They may not become a cop, and that's OK. We'd rather them find out now if it's what they really want to do."

The post meets twice each month (second and fourth Thursday) during the school year, from 6:30 to 8 p.m. at the Safety Services Building, 5171 Northwest Parkway. Members of the Hilliard Explorer Post are also allowed to ride along with patrol officers after their probationary period has been completed.

During meetings, Explorers focus on different types of police work, such as report writing, building searches, self-defense, and much more. HPD also brings in guest speakers from other avenues of law enforcement, such as Secret Service, FBI, ICE, etc., to talk to the Explorers about potential careers.

Hilliard police is currently accepting new Explorers. Those interested in more information about the program should contact Officer Deaton at mdeaton@hilliardohio.gov.

Although many Hilliard Explorers have gone on to careers in law enforcement, Muraco was once the only one who chose to join HPD. That changed in 2019 when Hilliard Explorer Luke White took the oath of office to serve as a Hilliard police officer.

"I went up to Luke on the day he was sworn in and introduced myself," said Muraco. "I told him I was passing the torch."



The City of Hilliard Partners with SwimAmerica for swim lessons. SwimAmerica is nationally known for a learn-to-swim program operated by the American Swimming Coaches Association. There are more than 500 program directors at more than 900 sites across the USA. It's a state-of-the-art learn-to-swim program, brought to you by the same people who have brought you the most successful sport team on the planet: the USA Olympic Swimming Team.

POLICIES

Fair Share

The Recreation and Parks Department is largely financed through taxes paid by individuals living or working within Hilliard city boundaries. For that reason, we verify residency annually. Those who are unable to verify that they live or work within Hilliard city boundaries must pay a higher fee. We also delay activating pool memberships until verification of residency or employment is provided. We accept proof of residency or employment in person at our Community Center during normal business hours; via mail at Hilliard Community Center, 3800 Veterans Memorial Drive, Hilliard, Ohio 43026; or by email at recandparks@hilliardohio.gov.

City Residents (R) receive the lowest rates. Having a Hilliard mailing address or attending Hilliard City Schools does not necessarily mean you live within city boundaries. We verify residency each year on the Franklin County Auditor's website. Renters must provide (in person or via email) a utility bill, government-issued ID, or other proof of residency.

Non-Residents Paying Hilliard Income Taxes (INC) also receive the resident rate. To prove employment, you

must provide a valid government-issued ID and one of the following each year:

- A pay stub from the previous 30 days that includes the employee's full name and current address.
- Proof of employment on company letterhead with the signature of the patron's supervisor or company president.

School District/Non-Residents (NR) are those who neither live nor work within Hilliard city boundaries. These individuals pay a higher fee.

Military Discount

We offer a 10-percent discount for active duty and veteran military personnel and their immediate families for pool memberships, rentals, and activities. This excludes third-party organizations and daily pool admission. Military ID must be provided in person to receive the discount.

Inclement Weather

In the event of inclement weather, Hilliard Recreation and Parks Department may close facilities or cancel/delay any program, special event, or drop-in activity. This decision is made for the safety of our patrons based upon the severity of roads and weather.

Programs Scheduled Before 5 p.m.

Programs/activities are canceled when Hilliard City School District closes or is on a delay due to inclement weather.

Programs Scheduled After 5 p.m.

Program cancellation after 5 p.m. is determined by 4 p.m. the day of the activity on weekdays.

Weekends

Cancellation is determined by 9 a.m. for Saturday and Sunday programs. To get the most up-to-date cancellation information follow our Facebook and Twitter pages, visit hilliardohio.gov, or call (614) 876-5200.

Full Refunds

Recreation and Parks Services

A full refund will be issued in the event of insufficient program enrollment for Recreation and Parks programs. Additionally, park/facility visitors or participants of activities planned and implemented by the City will be granted a full refund if the patron is not satisfied with the service rendered. Refund requests must be submitted in writing and indicate the reason or cause of dissatisfaction. No refunds are issued for pool memberships. You can find the refund policy on page 40.

Services by Independent Contractors


Refunds will be made according to the individual contractor's agreement.


Partial Refunds

A 10-percent service charge will be applied to refund requests for programs and/or services not yet rendered. For example, if patrons register for a program and later determine they are no longer interested, have a schedule conflict, or cannot participate for some other reason, they must submit a written request for a refund at least ten (10) days before the service date, activity, or first class of an instructional session.

Refunds will generally not be granted for requests with less than ten (10) days before the first session.

In unusual situations (patron is relocating, has an illness, becomes physically unable to continue program, etc.) where a refund is requested for services that have been paid in advance, the balance of the remaining value will be refunded after receipt of a written request.





Hilliard's Parks

From wooded areas to athletic facilities, Hilliard Recreation and Parks Department maintains parks and provides diverse recreational and leisure activities for the community. The department also organizes special events, maintains municipal pools, and sponsors educational, fitness, and volunteer activities for community members of all ages.



First Responders Park

Vowing that "we will never forget," the City of Hilliard created a place for reflection to pay tribute to first responders nationwide and to ensure the events of 9/11 are remembered.

Hilliard's Station Park

Hilliard's Station Park is near the Old Hilliard trailhead for the seven-mile Heritage Rail Trail. This community event space contains an amphitheater, spray pad, multifunctional building, outdoor café tables, public restroom, and storage/maintenance facility. Architectural features of the two buildings reflect the site's past use as a train depot. The fountains are on daily from 8 a.m. - 10 p.m. mid-May-September. Hours may vary during special events.

Heritage Trail Dog Park

Bring Fido out to this safe place for off-leash play! The park has one acre dedicated to small dogs and three acres for larger dogs. The park includes fun water-play features and a doggie drinking fountain. Pathways through the park lead to benches and shaded areas.

Green Space and Fields

RENTALS & FACILITIES

Facility Rentals

The Recreation and Parks Department rents select facilities and park shelters to community organizations, groups, and citizens. Learn more about renting a shelter, room, or other facility at hilliardohio.gov/facility-rentals or by contacting Hayley Bush at hbush@hilliardohio.gov.

Groups are responsible for all setup and cleanup and must provide their own supplies, decorations, table coverings, and food.

Community/Senior Center rentals for 150 or more people will be charged an additional \$100 custodial fee. A \$200 refundable deposit and the full rental fee must be paid with a major credit card or debit card at the time of reservation to reserve your event date. Deposit refunds will be credited to that original card within five business days, assuming facility rules are followed and no damage occurs.

Park shelters are for public purposes only. Groups renting City facilities are not permitted to charge admission or registration fees. Groups may not host events that raise funds for personal or for-profit organizations. There are no kitchen amenities available for public use at the facilities.

Refunds for Facility and Athletic Field Rentals

The City does not refund facility and athletic field fees (or down payments, if applicable) if a cancellation is made fewer than thirty (30) days before the reservation date. Cancellations made fewer than thirty (30) days in advance provide minimal opportunity for rental to another party.

A refund minus a 10-percent service charge will be approved when a registrant submits a written request at least thirty (30) days before the rental date. Exception: a non-refundable deposit is required to reserve an aquatic center or major multi-field complexes. The deposit will be credited toward the final payment of facility rental. If the reservation is canceled, the deposit is forfeited. The City, at its discretion, may allow the deposit to be credited to another event or reservation, provided the party making the reservation has not canceled previous reservations.

The Director of Recreation and Parks will review special requests when submitted in writing.

Shelter Houses

There are five shelter houses in Roger A. Reynolds Municipal Park that can be reserved for a non-refundable fee of \$100 per day (8 a.m. - 9 p.m.) Shelter rentals must be made online. 2020 reservations began Jan. 2, 2020.

Non-profit organizations are eligible for a reduced rental rate of \$50 per day. Proof of 501c3 must be provided.

Park Rental for 5K Walks / Runs

Roger A. Reynolds Municipal Park may be rented for 5K walks/runs for a \$200 fee per race. This includes a shelter house rental and use of Municipal Park trail. Contact Hayley Bush at hbush@hilliardohio.gov.


Hilliard's Station Park

With splash fountains, outdoor café tables, an amphitheater and public restrooms, Hilliard's Station Park is the perfect location for private or community events. Rental fees for Hilliard's Station Park include five round tables and 40 chairs. The building does not come equipped with running water, a sink area, refrigerator, freezer, or air conditioning.

The glass garage-style doors can be opened. The park does not close during building rental. City staff is not responsible for restricting the public from entering this event space during rentals. Hourly rental rates are \$75 for residents, \$100 for non-residents, and \$60 for non-profits. Rentals have a two-hour minimum. Rental space is available starting the third week of May through the second week of August.

Meeting Rooms

The Community Center and Senior Center are available for meetings, seminars, and private parties. Contact Hayley Bush at *hbush@hilliardohio.gov* for more information. Availability changes seasonally with programs.





Hilliard Family Aquatic Center (HFAC)

The Hilliard Family Aquatic Center is one of the largest outdoor municipal complexes in Ohio and features two 30-foot water slides, a 25-yard competition pool, an interactive leisure pool, a 540-foot lazy river, a main pool with a 10-foot slide, and an 11-foot diving well with two diving boards.

The main HFAC pool is always available when the facility is open, but other amenities may be unavailable. We reserve the right to close one or more pools if the need arises. Pool Hours

Both pools open Memorial Day weekend May 23-25, then open for the season May 30. The Hilliard Family Aquatic Center's last day of operation is Wednesday, Aug. 19. Lifeguard staff availability is reduced significantly beginning Aug. 20, the first day of the 2020-21 school year for Hilliard City Schools. The Clyde "Butch" Seidle Community Pool remains open through Labor Day with reduced hours.

The Clyde "Butch" Seidle Community Pool splash pad is open free to the public outside of the regular pool season from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on May 11- 22, May 26-29, and Sept. 8-30.

MEMBERSHIPS

Pool passes are valid at both locations. Key fobs allowing admission are mailed to new members and to those members who purchase add-on passes for the first time. Membership key fobs/add-on passes are not re-issued each year. Keep key fobs from season to season to avoid paying a \$5 replacement fee. All members must present key fobs at the gate or use the key ring app to enter either facility; otherwise patrons must pay the daily admission.

2020 memberships go on sale starting Jan. 2. Membership forms are processed as soon as possible after they are received. Rates for 2020, including discounted "Blue Splash Special," are available at hilliardohio.gov/pools-passes

Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.

Staff verifies residency for all applications within 72 business hours with Franklin County Auditor's Office.

There is a limit of two adults (age 21 and up) per membership. Both adults must live at the same address.

POOL POLICIES

Swimsuit Policy

Franklin County Board of Health sanitation regulations require all persons to wear a bathing suit with a hygienic liner while swimming. Clothing is only permitted on top of a bathing suit. Athletic shorts are not considered a swimsuit. If you are not wearing a bathing suit, you will be asked to exit the facility. Rain checks are issued in the event that you have paid the daily admission and are asked to leave due to lack of proper attire. Swim diapers are required for all individuals not potty trained and can be purchased in the pool office. We thank you for your cooperation as we strive to keep our swimming pools as safe and sanitary as possible.

Group Policy

Our number one concern is the safety and well-being of all of our guests. Daycares, day camps, and large groups frequently bring children to our outdoor pool facilities. Additional supervision of these children is imperative. Please ensure you meet the required adult/child ratio before coming to the pool to avoid disappointment of group members. All daycare centers and camps must sign an annual agreement. Inclement Weather

All guests must clear the pool at the first sound of thunder or sight of lightning. The pool must remain clear for 30 minutes after the last sound of thunder or sight of lightning. Each time thunder is heard, the 30 minutes restarts.

Heavy rain makes it difficult to see beneath the surface of the water. In the event that rain or heavy wind obstructs lifeguards' view, the pool is cleared until weather permits. In any circumstance, if the bottom of the pool is not visible, all swimmers are cleared until the water is safe to re-enter.

Refunds for daily admission are not issued under any circumstance. Facility admission is not granted during weather delays. Rain checks are only issued if you have been at the facility for less than 60 minutes before the weather delay. To receive a rain check, you must present your receipt. Please be aware of this policy and check the weather before paying the daily admission.

Swim Lessons

Children enrolled in swim lessons must be 3 years old by June 1 of the current year and fully potty trained. The pool water is heated. Recreation and Parks Department staff may cancel lessons due to inclement weather.

All participants are notified of cancellation via e-mail. There are no make-up classes.

The Recreation and Parks Department uses the SwimAmerica swim lesson program. SwimAmerica is nationally known for a learn-to-swim program operated by the American Swimming Coaches Association. There are more than 500 program directors at more than 900 sites across the USA.

New swimmers are evaluated and moved to their appropriate level based on the skills evaluated within the first few minutes of the first class of each session. Upon completion of the station goals, swimmers immediately receive a sticker and move up to the next level. They do not have to wait until the end of the session or until their classmates have completed the goals. Swim lessons are held when both water and air temperature are 70 degrees or higher.

Swimmers move through the progression independently at their own pace.

Swim lesson refunds/transfers

Refund requests and/or transfers must be submitted in writing at least seven days in advance of the first class to Lindsey Dembowski, Aquatics Recreation Aide, at *ldembowski@hilliardohio.gov*. Refunds may reflect a \$5 processing fee and are granted only for medical restriction, approved hardship, or relocation outside of a 25-mile radius of the Community Center. Documentation is required. No refunds are granted after July 3.

Refunds

Senior Center activity, program, and trip refunds of \$10 or more are refunded to member accounts. If a program is \$10 or more, the money is refunded to the original form of purchase payment. If a cancellation/refund request is for an activity or event for which advance tickets were purchased or reservations made, a refund is issued only if we can fill a reservation to another customer. If we are unable to fill the spot, no refund is provided.

Patrons also may transfer the ticket or reservation to a family member or friend. Refunds may reflect a processing fee. The City recommends buying travel insurance for trips scheduled through tour companies, as many have rigid refund deadlines.
