



Scavenger Hunt




Squirrel: Did you know squirrels eat mostly nuts, fruits, and seeds -- and that squirrels are born blind?

Daffodil: Did you know daffodils are one of the first flowers to bloom in the spring? Animals stay away from eating them because their bulbs contain poisonous crystals.




Bird nest: Did you know not all birds build nests? Two that don't are cowbirds, which lay their eggs in other birds' nests, and screech-owls, which use cavities that other birds or critters have hollowed out.

Insect: Did you know insect bodies have three parts, the thorax, abdomen, and head? Insects also have two antennae as well as three pairs of legs.



Tree: Did you know there are more than 99 different species of trees in Ohio? Often you can tell the different types by their leaves and bark.

Spiders: Did you know there are around 40,000 different species of spiders? Most spiders make silk, which they use to create spider webs and capture prey.



Flower bud: Did you know the buds on plants are an early indicator of new growth of some sort? While it may be difficult to discern whether the new growth is a flower or a leaf, identifying flower buds can generally be done by noting their location

Birds: Did you know there are 434 species of birds in Ohio? The cardinal was designated the official Ohio state bird in 1933 due to its prevalence throughout the state.
