March 3 - Decorative Arts Center—*Flower Power: Flora in Fashion* and Max & Erma's (10:15 a.m.)

Reg. Deadline: 2/24 Fee: \$5 at signup; lunch OYO Activity Level: Moderate

Visit the newest exhibition at the Decorative Arts Center of Ohio in Lancaster, *Flower Power: Flora in Fashion*. This visually-stunning exhibit explores the relationship humankind has with its natural environment, specifically how we adorn our bodies with botanical elements from head to toe. From extravagant hats to sublime shoes, fashion designers have found inspiration in colorful floral motifs and botanical elements. Nature's plant materials not only factor in the aesthetics of fashion and apparel, they literally are the very fabric used to make much of our clothing. *Flower Power: Flora in Fashion* will grow your appreciation for how the bark, leaves, grasses and seeds around us have been turned into textiles and clothing we use on a daily basis. This timeless classic set during the Civil War is filled with adventure, heartbreak, and a deep sense of hope. March 27 - Palace Theater Tour and Club 185 (10:45 a.m.)

Designed in the spirit of France's Palais de Versailles, the 2,695-seat Palace Theatre is located at the base of the LeVeque-Lincoln Tower in Columbus. Adorned with chandeliers, a grand staircase, mural, hall of autographed pictures, and a fountain, the Palace is a delightful destination for an evening with the arts. Originally a vaudeville house, special attention was paid to the theatre's acoustics when it was built. Consequently, there's not a bad seat in the house! Please note, there are no elevators; you must be able to climb stairs and stand for an extended time. Lunch afterwards at Club 185 in German Village.
