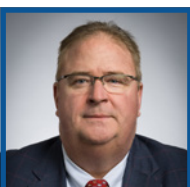

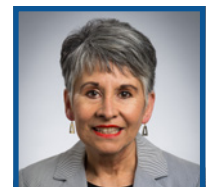

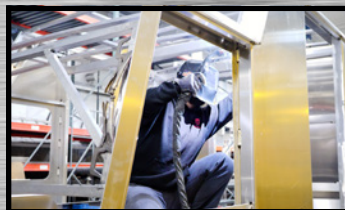

Recreation and Parks Program Guide Fall classes and programs



Hilliard is home to more than 1,100 diverse businesses, ranging from high-tech and manufacturing to health care, financial institutions, government, commercial districts, and more.

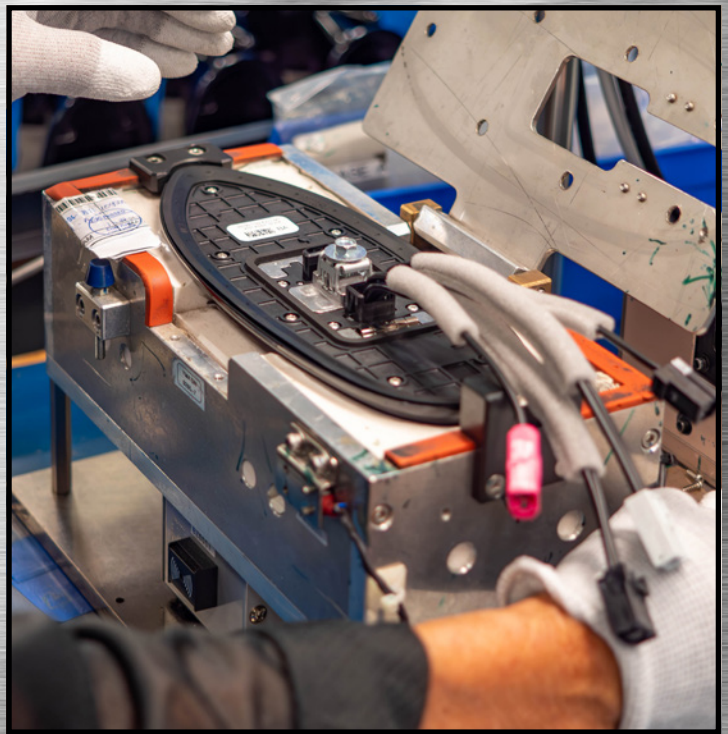
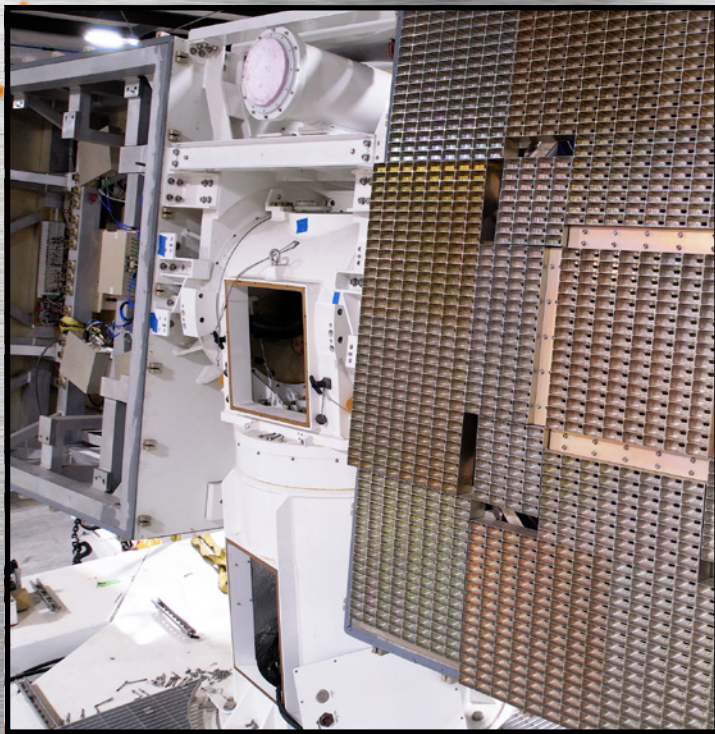
With all those companies, it might still be surprising about the kinds of things that are made in this community – items ranging from fire trucks and ceiling tiles to high-tech antennas and radar systems.

Sutphen Corporation

4500 Sutphen Court

Sutphen Corporation is the largest and oldest family-owned fire truck manufacturer in the United States, and one of its biggest operations is in Hilliard. The campus near I-270 includes eight buildings, where the team specializes in custom builds of the entire truck from the chassis up. Sutphen's mission is to build the safest, most reliable fire apparatus in the world through innovation and customer focus.

The company has supplied trucks for Norwich Township Fire Department for decades. Sutphen has four locations, with Hilliard employing about 95 of the company's 450 employees. The uniqueness of the Sutphen product is its all-aluminum and huck-bolted ladder design, a trademark of the Sutphen family. The Hilliard location started in the early 1970s and remains a vital part of the economic development landscape in the city more than 50 years later.



STAR Dynamics Corporation

4455 Reynolds Drive

The future of stealth radars and high-tech national defense is at STAR Dynamics, an industry leader with cutting-edge technology that is quite literally out of this world. The 48,000-square-foot facility on Reynolds Drive is dedicated to the design, assembly, and testing of complex radar systems. STAR's clientele is a combination of government and industry, with products measuring the stealthiness of planes, tanks, and boats and the accuracy of objects such as drones and missiles.

Ultimately, the company's goal is to save lives with its evolving technology. In the past few years, it has landed significant contracts with the U.S. Army, Navy, and Air Force, as well as several foreign allies. President and CEO Dr. Jerry Jost, a former NASA employee, was part of the team that acquired STAR Dynamics in 2007 and moved the operation to Hilliard for better growth opportunities. The company started with a small staff but now employs nearly 50 people with an annual revenue approaching \$20 million.

Yokowo Manufacturing of America

4081 Leap Road

Yokowo specializes in antenna and advanced technology manufacturing, primarily for the Japanese automotive industry. Hilliard is home to the company's first American headquarters, occupying its current Leap Road location since 2007. Yokowo supplies car antennas for Honda, Toyota, Nissan, Subaru, and General Motors. The Hilliard location employs 53 people who perform final assembly, and testing takes place before the antennas are shipped to customers daily across the United States.

The antennas resemble shark fins and can be customized to include an array of technologies, including telematics, GPS, satellite radio, AM/FM, and more. Yokowo assembles and ships between 1,000 and 2,000 antennas per day from its Hilliard warehouse. The company's next venture is expanding its products to the IoT (Internet of Things) market, where the goal is to connect various devices with antenna and data transfer technology.



Armstrong World Industries

4241 Leap Road

If you look up in your office building, there's a good chance your ceiling tiles were made by Armstrong World Industries (AWI). AWI is a trusted leader in manufacturing ceiling tiles and wall panels, offering a variety of sizes, shapes, colors, and edge finishes. The company's broad product portfolio provides innovative solutions that leverage science, design and sustainability to support industry needs. The Hilliard plant is one of 19 AWI manufacturing locations across the United States and Canada.

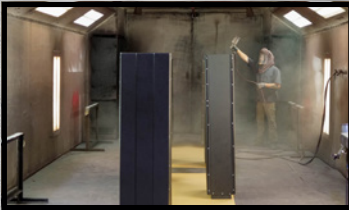
The Hilliard plant opened in 1987 and currently employs 175 people, with multiple assembly lines throughout its 420,000 square-foot facility. This year, the Leap Road facility is on track to produce more than 60 million square feet of panels. Hilliard is the only AWI location specializing in fiberglass panels with customized geometric shapes and colors. Earlier this year, the Hilliard plant was recognized by *Ohio Business Magazine* as one of the Best Workplaces in Ohio for 2024.

Vanner Inc., A Havis Company

4282 Reynolds Drive

Established in 1977, Vanner Inc. is a leading force in the transportation industry. It specializes in power electronics conversion and system integration for commercial vehicles including ambulances, work trucks, military vehicles, and transit buses. Based in Hilliard, Vanner operates an award-winning assembly plant and serves as one of four product design centers for its parent company, Havis, in the United States.

Vanner has earned a strong reputation for delivering high-quality power electronics conversion products on time, serving original equipment manufacturers, transit companies, and aftermarket suppliers. The company offers customized solutions for businesses of all sizes globally. Locally, Norwich Township ambulances rely on Vanner inverters to power life support equipment, while the City of Hilliard Division of Police vehicles are equipped with Havis technology in their cruisers.



National Sign Systems/ CityScapes

4200 Lyman Court

Founded in 1987, National Sign Systems has grown from a small operation into a leading name in sign manufacturing. The company employs 125 people and operates from a state-of-the-art, 180,000-square-foot facility just off I-270.

Known for pioneering designs and innovations, National Sign Systems has revolutionized drive-thru menu boards and custom signage solutions for top brands like Wendy's, Jack in the Box, and Little Caesars.

In-house production capabilities include steel and aluminum cabinet fabrication, pressing, painting, channeling, wiring, and neon and LED illumination.

CityScapes, its sister company, is also inside the Lyman Court building. CityScapes' product line includes roof screen systems, customizable walls and enclosures, and trellis systems for plant support. These solutions provide privacy, security, and enhanced visual appeal, while meeting stringent building code requirements.

Crafted from durable, low-maintenance materials, CityScapes' products are tailored to meet the specific needs of architects, contractors, and building owners.

Baesman Group

4477 Reynolds Drive

Hilliard is also home to one of the top full-service marketing agencies in the Midwest. The Baesman Group started as a printing company and now offers a full range of services from direct marketing strategy and personalized communications to direct mail and fulfillment. The family-owned business started in Central Ohio in 1952 and eventually moved its corporate headquarters to Hilliard in 1995.

Since choosing Hilliard, Baesman has grown its business five times, now employing around 140 people and producing \$35 million in annual revenue. The company works with nationally known brands in the retail, restaurant, healthcare, and financial service industries.

The company is a fourth-generation family business, with brothers Rod Baesman (CEO) and Tyler Baesman (President) currently running its operations. The Reynolds Drive facility includes a pair of 100,000-square-foot warehouses that print over 150 million pieces of mail a year.

Volunteers Working

To Keep Hilliard Beautiful

A grassroots volunteer organization affiliated with Keep America Beautiful is working alongside the City of Hilliard Environmental Sustainability Commission (ESC) to clean up City parks, trails, and roadways.

Keep Hilliard Beautiful (KHB) was founded at the end of 2017, when Hilliard City Council approached the ESC and asked the group to sign on as an affiliate of Keep America Beautiful. The national non-profit is the largest community improvement organization in the United States, with more than 1,000 partner organizations.

Hilliard resident Melissa Muth has been a member of the ESC since 2016 and was instrumental in jumpstarting KHB, now serving as its vice chair. Both entities have similarities and overlap, but Muth explains the ESC is “more governmental.” It advises City Council and staff on programs that help Hilliard reach its sustainability goals.

KHB, on the other hand, is a local affiliate of Keep America Beautiful. ESC is also known as “Go Green Hilliard,” a more memorable name referenced on their website, gogreenhilliard.com.

“We all have a very similar mission of preserving our community while inspiring and educating others,” Muth said. “Bottom line is we have one Earth, and it’s our job to take care of her.”

The three pillars of KHB are to end littering, beautify communities, and improve recycling. The mission is to encourage collaboration among Hilliard groups and organizations, to share project ideas, and to ensure the community is working together on common goals. A primary outreach function of KHB is organizing monthly litter pick-up events on Saturday mornings at various Hilliard locations.

“I’ve been very pleased with what we’ve been able to accomplish in the past few years. We actually have a name for ourselves now,” said Lori Plinke, Chair of KHB. “We’ve had as many as 50 people show up to these litter clean-up events, and it’s inspiring to see people of all ages come together for one common cause.”

The next step for KHB is a renewed focus on recycling education while working with local businesses and apartment complexes that may not have recycling facilities. The group has also pledged to be part of Keep America Beautiful’s “Great American Cleanup”, which hopes to collect 25 billion pieces of litter and beautify 25,000 communities across the country before America’s 250th birthday on July 4, 2026.

“The fact that the City of Hilliard is committed to staying clean and pledging to be green is really wonderful and says a lot about this community,” Plinke said. “Keep Hilliard Beautiful is really about a making a legacy impact for the next generation.”

KHB is always looking for volunteers for its monthly litter pickups, and there are also opportunities to be more involved as a board member. Even if you’re unable to attend a clean-up event on a Saturday morning, there are still ways to give back.

“One of the best things anyone can do for our environment is to plant an oak tree or a pollinator garden in their yard,” Muth said. “It’s easier to do than you think and positively impacts our ecosystem for decades.”

HIGHLIGHTS ALL THINGS HILLIARD

If you ask Samantha Brill how to best spend a weekend in Hilliard, you may want to set aside some time for the conversation.

As the Executive Director of Destination Hilliard, she knows the City inside and out, including each hotel, venue, event, and unique feature that make the community special.

Destination Hilliard is a destination marketing organization that strives to increase and elevate the visibility and image of Hilliard. The mission is to encourage the economic vibrancy of Hilliard by developing and promoting special events, attractions, culture, history, recreation, parks, dining, retail, meeting and event space use, and overnight accommodations.

"I have lived in Hilliard for more than 40 years," Brill said. "My love for this community is genuine, so shining a light on all of the reasons Hilliard is a great place to live, work, and visit comes naturally."

Destination Hilliard uses a multitude of resources to shine a light on the Hilliard experience – most notably social media, email newsletters, website, print media, and events. The organization publishes a visitor's guide that can be found at Hilliard hotels and at select business locations. They can also be requested via email.

The organization's website is a one-stop shop for all things Hilliard, with tools for planning a visit including dining, shopping, entertainment, and sleep accommodation resources in addition to blogs throughout the site to highlight local gems and upcoming happenings. The most visited page on the site is the calendar, featuring daily events in Hilliard and surrounding areas including live music, family activities, festivals, and nightlife.

The nonprofit organization is primarily funded by hotel occupancy taxes and is a separate entity from the City of Hilliard. Brill said the collaboration with the City "truly elevates the impact we can make on this community."

"The events hosted by the City are enjoyed by residents and visitors alike, and Destination Hilliard contributes by marketing these events," Brill said, referencing the City's Celebration at the Station summer concert series and Freedom Fest, among others.

Destination Hilliard hosts its own events that complement the lineup of City celebrations, including Halloween Haunt, For the Love of Hilliard (a City collaboration), and Holly Hop: Sip, Shop & Stroll.

"The businesses in Hilliard are truly invested in fostering an experience for every patron that walks through their doors," Brill added. "The welcoming vibes of the community create an environment where people create lasting memories that encourage them to come back time and time again."

Upcoming events hosted by Destination Hilliard include:

Holly Hop: Dec. 12, 6 to 9 p.m. Earn an exclusive tote by shopping at local businesses, enjoying special promotions and exclusive drinks throughout the designated outdoor refreshment area in Downtown Hilliard.

Noon Years Eve: Dec. 31, 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. (collaboration with the City of Hilliard) Countdown to noon for a New Year's Celebration! Head to Hilliard's Station Park on Dec. 31 for a unique event to allow families to experience a New Year's Eve countdown without waiting for midnight. Be sure to check out Downtown businesses hosting activities for families as well. ■

After the holidays are over in Hilliard, live Christmas trees are picked up to be recycled by Local Waste Services. Residents can leave trees at the curb, free of ornaments and lights, on Dec. 31, Jan. 7, and Jan. 14.



Ready To Fight Old Man Winter?

Residents can assist the snow plowing process in several ways:

- Do not shovel or plow snow into city streets, onto driveway aprons, or around fire hydrants or mailboxes.
- Keep your distance from the snow plows. Do not attempt to pass a snow plow.
- Keep children away from snow plows.
- Remove parked cars from the street.
- Keep your sidewalks and driveway aprons free of snow and ice.

If you are new to Hilliard Recreation and Parks, you must establish a RecTrac account. Within three business days, our staff will verify your residency and activate your account. During this process, patrons will create their own username and password if setting up their account online. RecTrac will automatically create a username and password for patrons setting up accounts in person at the Community Center.

With your existing or newly verified account, go to hilliardohio.gov/registration and sign in with your username and password. Find classes by clicking "search" and then select criteria that fit your interests.

Accommodation Request

The City of Hilliard promotes inclusion for all our programming, camps, and service options. Contact a recreation supervisor to discuss accommodations before enrollment to receive an inquiry of needs so we can develop an accommodation plan and provide the best overall experience for you and your child. An accommodation plan could carry over IEP/504 accommodations. If the need for an accommodation arises after a program starts, please contact the Community Center at 614-876-5200 to be directed to the appropriate recreation supervisor.

Code of Conduct

Upon entering a City of Hilliard recreation facility and/or participating in a Recreation and Parks Department program, you are agreeing to abide by the rules of the department and any specific rules for programs or facilities. Your cooperation and consideration of this code of conduct helps ensure all participants can enjoy our programs, facilities, and parks. The Recreation and Parks Department is committed to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all our patrons and staff.

Fair Share

The Recreation and Parks Department is largely financed through taxes paid by individuals living or working within Hilliard city boundaries. For that reason, we verify residency annually. Those who are unable to verify that they live or work within Hilliard city boundaries must pay a higher fee. We delay activating pool memberships until verification of residency or employment is provided. We accept proof of residency or employment in person at our Community Center during normal business hours; via mail at Hilliard Community Center, 3800 Veterans Memorial Drive, Hilliard, Ohio 43026; by email at recandparks@hilliardohio.gov; or uploaded to a RecTrac account.

City Residents receive the lowest rates. Having a Hilliard mailing address or attending Hilliard City Schools does not necessarily mean you live within city boundaries. We verify residency each year on the Franklin County Auditor's website. Renters must provide (in person or via email) a utility bill, government-issued ID, or other proof of residency.

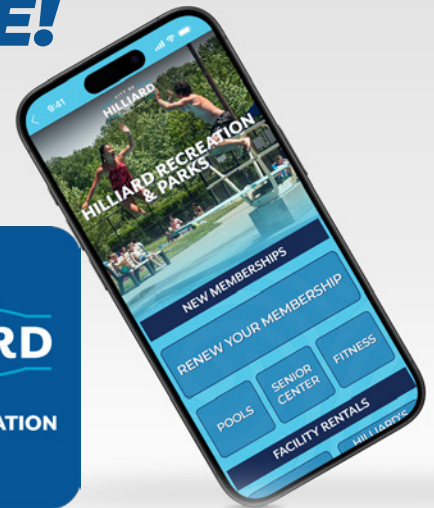
Non-Residents paying Hilliard income taxes also receive the resident rate. To prove employment, you must provide a valid government-issued ID and one of the following each year:

- A pay stub from the previous 30 days that includes the employee's full name and current address.
- Proof of employment on company letterhead with the signature of the patron's supervisor or company president

Refunds

All refund requests must be submitted in writing to recandparks@hilliardohio.gov in accordance with the policies below.

Low Enrollment If a program/class does not meet the minimum requirement of participants, the class will be canceled and a full refund will be issued to those enrolled.

General Recreation Program Any cancellation or request for a refund prior to 10 days of the start of the program/class will result in a full refund. If a cancellation or refund request is needed within the 10-day window of that program/class starting, a 10% processing fee will be charged. If the cancellation drops the program/class below the minimum student enrollment, a refund will not be issued.

55 Plus A full refund is issued if registration is canceled before the posted deadline. Refunds less than \$10 are automatically credited to your household account. Trip registrations canceled after the posted deadline are not eligible for refunds unless there is a waiting list and someone is able to take your place.

Swim Lessons Refund requests and/or transfers must be submitted at least seven days before the first class. Refunds may reflect a \$5 processing fee and are granted only for medical restriction, approved hardship, or relocation outside of a 25-mile radius of the Community Center. Documentation is required.

Pool Membership Refunds are not issued for pool memberships.

Summer Rec Camp Cancellation requests submitted by March 15 will result in a \$75 processing fee. Refunds will not be issued after March 15.

Inclement Weather In the event of inclement weather, the Recreation and Parks Department may close facilities or cancel/delay any program, special event, or drop-in activity.

This decision is made for the safety of our patrons based upon the severity of roads and weather.

To get up-to-date cancellation information, follow our Facebook pages, visit hilliardohio.gov, or call (614) 334-2598. This line is updated daily with changes, closures, and cancellations of special events, aquatics, sports, and programs.

Programs scheduled before 5 p.m. are canceled when Hilliard City School District closes or is on a delay due to inclement weather.

Canceled programs scheduled after 5 p.m. are determined by 4 p.m. the day of the activity on weekdays.

Weekend cancellation is determined and communicated before 9 a.m. Programs are canceled at 7:30 a.m. if a Level 2 snow emergency exists.

Military Discount

We offer a 10% discount for active duty and veteran military personnel and their immediate families for pool memberships, rentals, and activities. This excludes daily pool admission. Military ID must be provided in person to receive the discount.

AQUATICS

Hilliard operates two seasonal outdoor facilities: the **Hilliard Family Aquatic Center (HFAC)** and the **Clyde "Butch" Seidle Community Pool (CBS)**. In addition to providing a safe space for families to play and spend time together, the municipal pools also organize swim lessons and events for community members of all ages.

Children 13 and under must be accompanied by an adult 18 or older and must have their visitor pass or membership. Children ages 14-17 may enter without an adult if they have a valid visitor pass or membership and have completed the required "Minor Use and Rules Agreement Form" on file. That form can be found online at hilliardohio.gov/pools-passes/. Completed forms can be uploaded on a RecTrac account, emailed to recandparks@hilliardohio.gov, or dropped off at the Community Center, 3800 Veterans Memorial Dr.

The CBS Community Pool features a bath house, concession stand, and a shaded area. There is a main pool with a 14-foot water slide and an interactive splash pad.

Pool Areas and Amenities

The main pool is always available when the facility is open, but some amenities at HFAC may be unavailable. We reserve the right to reduce hours or to close one or more pools, specific amenities, or facilities if the need arises due to staffing, programming, or weather. The purchase of a pool membership or daily admission guarantees use of the main pool at either facility.

Pool Memberships

Pool passes are valid at both locations. Key fobs allowing admission are mailed to new members and to those members who buy add-on passes for the first time. Membership key fobs/ add-on passes are not re-issued each year. Keep key fobs from season to season to avoid paying a \$5 replacement fee. All members must present key fobs at the gate or show their barcode to enter either facility. Otherwise, members will be denied entry. Membership forms are processed as soon as possible after they are received. Staff verifies residency for all applications within three business days with Franklin County Auditor's Office. There is a limit of two adults (age 21 and up) per membership. Both adults must live at the same address. Memberships are non-refundable and nontransferable.

Buy Your Membership

Online - Those with 2024 memberships may renew online at hilliardohio.gov/pools-passes/. Those buying new memberships must register an account online before purchasing. Online account verification may take up to three business days for activation.

In Person - Visit the Hilliard Community Center, 3800 Veterans Memorial Dr., during regular business hours. The Hilliard Community Center accepts major credit cards, debit cards, Apple Pay, and checks. Cash is not accepted for membership purchases. To avoid lines, we encourage you to use our online or mail options.

Daily Admission

For increased patron safety, a visitor pass associated with a RecTrac account is required for entry to any pool facility. All patrons ages 3 years and older must have a valid visitor pass or pool membership for entry. Visitors or members under age 18 must register under an adult's (18+) account. All visitor accounts require an adult (18+) as a responsible party.

Account registration can be done online or at the Hilliard Community Center during normal business hours and must be done before visiting the pool. Online account registration may take up to three business days for activation. After an account has been registered, day pass key fobs are provided to each household member at no cost. Replacement key fobs are \$5 each.

Visitors must present their key fob to enter the facility. Children 13 and under must be accompanied by an adult (18+) in addition to presenting their visitor pass. Children ages 14-17 may gain admission without an adult if they have a valid visitor pass and have a completed "Minor Use and Rules Agreement Form" on file.

We accept cash, all major credit/debit cards, and Apple Pay for daily admission. Checks are not accepted at the pools.

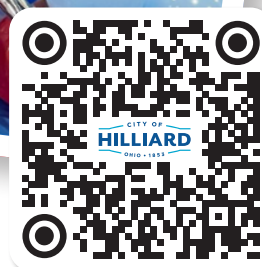

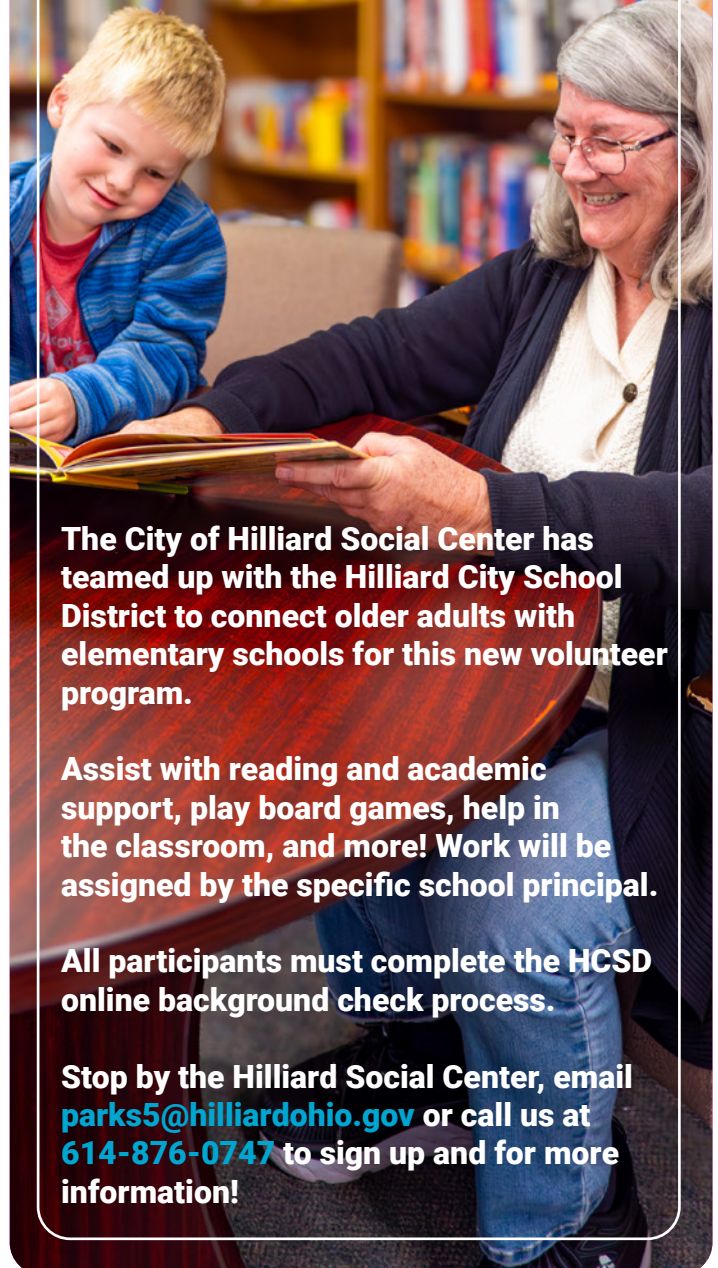

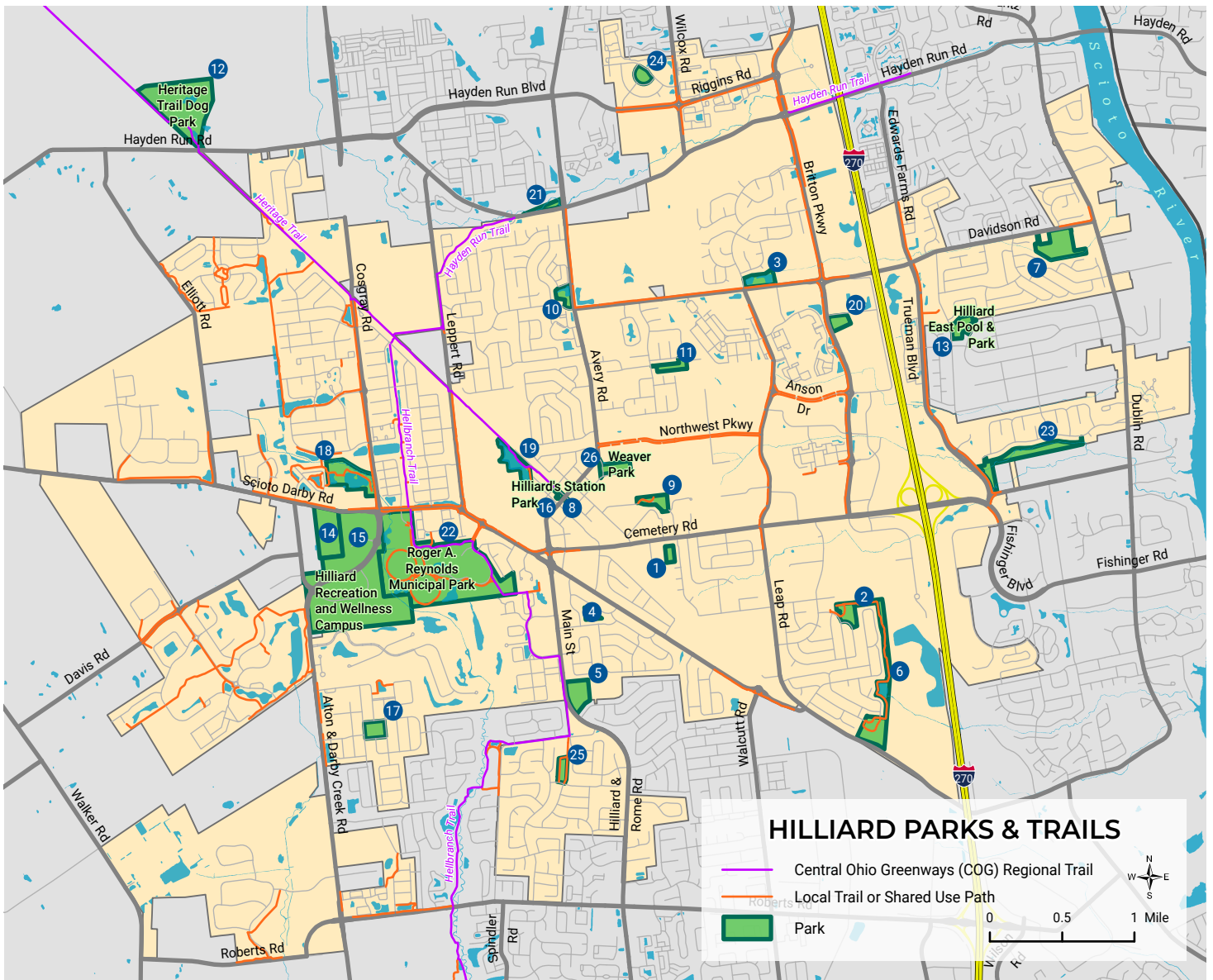
